In preparation for this, you will be provided with information about the qualifications available to you next year in assemblies and during lessons. In addition, this booklet will support you in making your choices for your Key Stage 4 courses.

At Key Stage 4, you will follow a broad and balanced curriculum that consists of the following core subjects: English, Mathematics, Science the Skills Challenge Certificate, Welsh and Physical Education.

Additionally, you have the opportunity to choose up to another three subjects in your Pathway. When choosing your optional subjects consider the following:

- Which subjects do I enjoy and do well in?
- Which is my preferred learning style?
- Do I prefer examinations or portfolio/non-examined work?
- What skills do I need to develop to support my future whether it be in further education, training or employment?

This is your future so please do not choose a course just because your friends are doing it or because you like the teacher. You must choose the subjects that you want to do and those that you feel that you will be successful in. Talk to your subject teachers, review tutors and parents as they will also guide and advise you about which courses are most suitable for you. It is therefore important that you think carefully about what you want to do when you finish school.

The Welsh Baccalaureate is based on the Skills Challenge GCSE alongside Supporting Qualifications. To achieve the overarching Welsh Baccalaureate learners must pass the Skills Challenge Certificate and other supporting qualifications.

What will I be doing on the course? How will it be structured?

The course consists of three Units:

Unit 1: Oracy (20%)

This Unit consists of two internal Oracy assessment tasks. Task 1 (10%) is an Individual Researched Presentation and Task 2 (10%) is a group discussion which assesses the learners ability to interact and respond with their peers.

Unit 2: Reading and Writing: Description, Narration and Exposition (40%)

This Unit consists of an external assessment. Learners are required to understand a range of texts and answer structured questions on these. In the second part of the exam learners will be required to select one writing task from a choice of two. This assessment will also include an editing task and a proof-reading task.

Unit 3: Reading and Writing: Argumentation, Persuasion and Instructional (40%)

This Unit consists of an external assessment. Learners are required to understand a range of texts and answer structured questions on these. In the second part of the exam learners will be required to complete two writing tasks.

What could I use this qualification for?

GCSE English Language is a versatile qualification and will benefit many career paths. It would enable learners to engage in a career in journalism, law or teaching. In addition, GCSE English Language also supports the skills needed for many other careers, educational courses and further education.

Core – English Literature

Title of the course: English Literature (WJEC)

What is the qualification?

GCSE English Literature can extend learners' interest in, and enthusiasm for, written texts as they develop an understanding of the ways in which literature is rich and influential. It is a Level 2 qualification which enables learners to:

- understand that texts from English, Welsh or Irish literary heritage have been influential and significant over time and explore their meaning today
- explore how texts from different cultures and traditions may reflect or influence values, assumptions and a sense of identity
- connect ideas, themes and issues, drawing on a range of texts, experience different times, cultures, viewpoints and situations as found in literary texts
- foster an appreciation of Wales' cultural heritage through the study of Welsh writing in English.

What will I be doing on the course? How will it be structured? The course consists of three units.

Unit 1: Prose and Poetry (35%)

This Unit consists of an external assessment. Learners are required to study a prose text and understand the themes, characters and ideas explored within it. An awareness of cultural and social context is also explored. Learners are also required to compare two unseen poems.

Unit 2: Heritage drama and contemporary prose (40%)

This Unit consists of an external assessment. Learners are required to study a prose text and a drama text demonstrating and understanding of the themes, characters and ideas explored within the texts. An awareness of cultural and social context is also explored.

Unit 3: Shakespeare and Welsh Writing in English (25%)

This Unit consists of two internal assessment tasks. Task 1 (12.5%) is an Individual Researched Presentation and Task 2 (10%) is a group discussion which assesses the learners ability to interact and respond with their peers.

Title of the course: Mathematics - Numeracy & Mathematics (WJEC)

What is the qualification?

Two separately awarded GCSE's. The GCSE 'Mathematics' qualification will extend to aspects of Mathematics needed for progression to scientific, technical or further mathematical study; whereas the 'Numeracy' qualification will assess the Mathematics that learners will need in their everyday lives, in the world of work, and in other general curriculum areas.

The department follows the programme of study as set out by the WJEC examination board. There are three levels of entry in both qualifications; Higher tier (A*-D), Intermediate tier (B-E) and Foundation tier (D-G).

- 2. Ability to experiment with ideas, materials, composition, designs and artistic techniques, informed by your research.
- 3. Ability to create observational drawing from primary sources using different media, photographs, films, and collecting secondary source to inform and develop your artwork.
- 4. Good annotation and evaluation skills to document the journey of the projects.
- 5. A creative approach for the final pieces that demonstrates the realisation of your intentions/ideas.

What could I use this qualification for?

This qualification could be used for employment opportunities as an Architect, Illustrator, Jeweller, Advertiser, Art Teacher, Games Designer, Artist, Curator, Gallery technician, Art journalist or Photographer.

Further education: A Level Art, Art degree.

Additional Information

When opting for the GCSE Art, Craft and Design it is recommended that learners purchase an A4 to A3 size sketchbook for the course and an A2 to A1 art to carry out coursework. There are also regular after school Art Club sessions to support the course which run from 3:15pm - 4:15pm on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday.
